AROSC, as a chapter, were reluctant to be convention producers, but 30 of our people stepped up to make this meeting a success for the 300+ members who came from across the country to enjoy our coastal climate and SoCal hospitality. And 70+ chapter members attended.

It was noteworthy that Alfa Romeo North America supported the event with sponsorship funds and sent its president, press relations chief and social media content generators to hang out

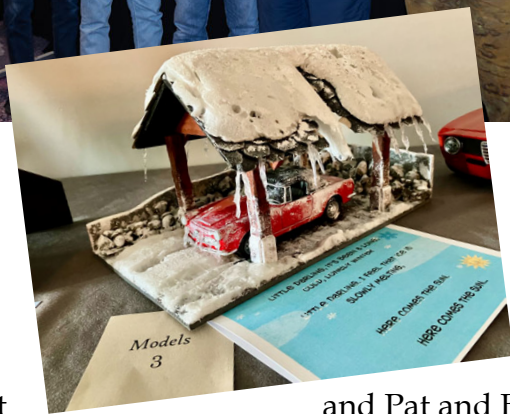
sold (and then bought!) a couple of items. It was fun to make this unlikely event happen.

Award winner); Shelly Zide's '72 Trans-Am winning GTV, Mike Baum and Bronson Page's Junior Z and Giulietta Sprint (Ed Mackey Award for Giuliettas winner); Herb and Rose Wysard's 6C 2500 cabriolet; Dorian Valenzuela's Giulia Sprint GT, and Val Dietrich's 2000 Touring. Thank you, Jim Barrett, for curating this unique gathering of Alfa

excellence. He even got Alfa Romeo of Irvine to send their showroom show-stopping 6C 2500 to Coronado for the morning. In addition, six member cars among the 17 submitted for *Certificato d'Oro* judging earned their certificates for originality and overall period correctness. Remembering Al Cortes

My good friend and longtime AROSC member, Al Cortes, passed away in May after a prolonged illness. Al's passion for all things automotive came at an early age, with his first car, a 1928 Oldsmobile. After high school Al served in the Navy and upon discharge the GI Bill enabled him to attend college, graduating with a BA in engineering from USC. He put that degree to work in the aerospace industry for more than 30 years. It was about this time that Al saw a 1952 Alfa Romeo 1900 Touring Coupe on a used car lot in Los Angeles. Smitten with the form and the artistic lines of the Alfa, Al became an inveterate *Alfista*. He purchased that 1900, and retained ownership of this car until his passing.

His membership in the Alfa Romeo Owners Club began in 1963. Al served as president of AROSC in 1982 and was active in various capacities for decades. A champion of early postwar cars, Al's knowledge of the 2500, 1900, 2600 and early 2-liter cars was profound. He established Exoticar, a restoration shop in Lawndale, and the business flourished as he supplied parts for the aforementioned early cars and in his machine shop, manufactured specialized lightweight racing components for Alfas and many other marques. Al's cars, including his 2600 Zagato Coupe were also featured on the cover of *Alfa Owner*. It was this 2600 Zagato that he, restored to a level that resulted in a class win at Pebble Beach.

During this time his interests expanded into competing on track. He prepared a GTA and became a distinguished member of the vintage racing community. His nature was always "drive to win" and in the early 1990s, he was retained to co-drive a vintage Ferrari in the prestigious re-enactment of the historic Mille Miglia.

In 2010 Al completed an engineering *tour de force* in designing and building his own Alfa Romeo tribute 3000 CM utilizing a 2600 engine and a modern Milano transaxle. The tubular frame was his own design utilizing original Alfa Romeo drawings. His creation received many accolades and was a special feature at the 2010 Concorso Italiano. Al pushed the limit with regard to modifying cast iron 2-liter engines by adding counterweights to the crankshaft to gain higher rpm. One of these highly modified engines, installed in a 2L Touring Spider has stood the test of time, as it is still campaigned by a prominent AROSC member today.

Al Cortes is survived by his two brothers Joe and Rene, his children, Tony, Melanie and Alex, and many friends. He will be sorely missed.
